Thursday, July 11 Managing Combined Sewer Overflows with Green Infrastructure Federal law requires communities throughout Indiana to eliminate CSO discharges. The Town of Speedway has designed and installed green infrastructure practices that bring their Long Term Control Plan to a 90% completion status. Green infrastructure cost savings were achieved via reduced construction costs and lower interest rates; rates available only to green storm water management solutions. Tour the Prairie Creek Barrens Nature Preserve with the Indiana Native Plant and Wildflower Society, led by Harold Allison, naturalist and columnist; and Michael Homoya, botanist/plant ecologist, Indiana DNR Division of Nature Preserves. The preserve hosts one of the last remnants of sand barrens in southwest Indiana. Many uncommon and rare species are present, including sand hickory, Maryland meadow beauty, and tube beard tongue. Ten years ago restoration efforts were undertaken and thousands of plugs were planted by volunteers, including many INPAWS members. Good Idea Put Your Mower Away Roadsides are too important to be neglected in pollinator conservation. Occupying more than 10-million acres of land in the United States, they provide corridors between remnant habitat patches, and in some areas, may be the only semi-natural habitat remaining. Whether you are a rural landowner with a mile of roadside frontage, or a city dweller with a 10-foot parking strip, you can have a direct impact on protecting and providing roadside habitat. Mow higher and less often to allow small wildflowers and clover to bloom. Consider replacing areas of turf grass with wildflowers. You can also remove the pavement itself, at least in parking lots and driveways. Check out the website of Depave for inspiration and ideas.

New Service Leave the Composting to Us Indy's first food waste composting service is up and collecting! MyComposter! takes the work out of composting. It's designed as a small-batch composting service for small commercial food service operations, restaurants, and residences. You scrape your compost materials into their MyComposter! bin, and they pick it up and compost it for you. When the compost is ready, they use it to plant organic vegetable gardens at local schools, community supported agriculture sites, and in distressed areas to promote urban gardening.
